English

- Compose a sentence orally before writing it.

- Re-read what they have written to check that it makes sense.

- Count, calculate and compare money
- Recognise and use the multiplication symbol

Science

Squash, bend, stretch & Living things in their habitat

- Test materials for elasticity and flexibility
- Investigate habitats and food chains

<u>Art</u>

 How do artists use their creativity to look at the world in new ways and use their hands to transform materials into new things?

<u>P.E.</u>

- To perform a sequence of movements with some changes in level, direction and speed.
- To apply a range of skills with good control and consistency.

Geography

- Name different types of maps and explain some key features of maps.
- Draw a simple sketch map
- Name the four points of a compass.

Computing

- Follow instructions given by someone else.
- Use a computer program to present information in different ways.

French

 Respond to words and phrases in familiar stories. The learning context is the book 'Devine qui je suis'.

History

- Use a wide vocabulary of everyday historical terms e.g. before, after, a long time ago.
- Compare aspects of life in different periods.

<u>Music</u>

- Confidently perform increasingly complicated rhythms.
- Begin to compose, represent our sounds with a range of symbols, shapes or marks.

PSHE

 Identify situations in which they would need to say 'Yes', 'No', 'I'll ask', or 'I'll tell', in relation to keeping themselves and others safe.

RE

- Who was Buddha?
- Why is the Torah special?
