

## Topics:

## Communication and Language:

- Show an interest in playing sounds, songs and rhymes.
- Understand simple sentences.
- Respond to simple instructions.
- To ask simple questions.
- Understand more complex sentences to develop their language.



### Physical Development:

- Make a connection between their movements and the marks they make.
- Turn pages in a book, showing care for the books.
- Catch a ball.
- Try to wash hands independently.



#### Personal, Social and Emotional:

- Separate happily from their main parent/carer
- Play alongside others.
- Explore new toys and environment but "check in" with a familiar adult as and when needed.
- Respond to a few appropriate boundaries with encouragement and support.
- Respond to the feelings and wishes of others.
- Be aware of own feelings and know that some actions and words can hurt others feelings.





#### Literacy:

- Repeat words or phrases from familiar stories.
- Listen to stories with increasing attention and recall.
- Look at books independently.
- Distinguish the marks they make.
- Learn to handle books carefully.
- Sometimes give meaning to marks as they draw and paint.




We have fruit and snack sharing in the Nursery. Parents provide just one or two boxes of fruit or snacks per week.
